Friends of Farthing Downs

The Friends was formed in 2005 with the full support of the City of London who have owned and managed Farthing Downs for the benefit of the public since 1883. It is a fully constituted body and is led by a committee of volunteers who meet regularly with representatives from the City.

Farthing Downs is protected by Green Belt and Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) status. Its unique chalk grassland provides a home for wild flowers, including the rare Greater Yellow Rattle and rare orchids, and increasingly threatened species of birds and insects. Its open space and free access provides leisure facilities for local residents and visitors alike, including woodland, open downland and views of local and distant landmarks from the many footpaths and bridleways. Signposted walks include the London Loop, Downland Circular Walk and the Farthing Downs and Happy Valley Nature Trail.

Farthing Downs is a Scheduled Ancient Monument with distinctive Celtic field systems, Saxon burial tumuli, Neolithic trackways and WWII anti-aircraft trenches.

2005: Inauguration

2006: Won grant from English Heritage for Farthing Downs archaeological survey.



2007: Raised funds for refurbishment of bronze plaque on the Millennium Cairn.

2008: Family Learning Week in partnership with Coulsdon Library – talks and walks and visits to local schools.

2009-11: Arranged public consultation on City plans for refurbishment of the car park – sponsored information board for the new Visitor Gathering Area.

2011: Sponsored new beech tree for The Folly and wildlife night-time camera.

2012: Sponsorship of the Association of Croydon Conservation Societies' updated 'Croydon for All' leaflet.

2013-14: Start of Friends' project to green Coulsdon South Station (Waitrose 'Community Matters' grant) – on-going. Sponsorship of updated 'Happy Valley & Farthing Downs' Nature Trail booklet. The new Trail posts have QR codes which link to the Friends website.
